Editorial

I have been a member of the Executive Committee (EC) for six months now, and it is my time to write the editorial. I was very excited when my first article about "Free mobility of health professionals within the European Union" was published in 2015 in COTEC newsletter. Back then I was not yet part of the EC; today I would like to write about my impressions of being part of COTEC EC.

So far it has been a very exciting time, the first thing was and still is to understand how the daily activities work within a pan-European organisation like COTEC. It appeared to me pretty fast, that in addition to skype meetings, the interim face to face meetings are vital to achieve progress in accordance with the COTEC Action plan. During these meetings we have the chance to reflect about what happened, discuss issues that arose, and decide on how to proceed. Reading across the minutes of the last two meetings I identified five main areas that were repeatedly discussed. These are member associations, the congress in Galway,

professional issues, collaboration with other organisations and issues part of the internal organisation. Giving all these topics the importance they need, is what determines a good decision making process. However I asked myself, how is it possible to balance the priorities amongst the aforementioned issues and simultaneously include the mandate of the general assembly (GA)? Working with colleagues that have been involved with COTEC for many years, demonstrated me, that not only keeping in mind the resolutions of the last GA is of significance, but also the development of occupational therapy in Europe through the years. Thankfully, they all are blessed with patience and take some of their free time to help me understand the changes COTEC went through. From the day COTEC was founded 30 years ago in 1986 (which is my year of birth) until the point ENOTHE was established, beyond the development of the Tuning competences, till this year when we are going to arrange the first COTEC-ENOTHE joint congress. These steps in COTEC's history show how occupational therapists advocate for our profession. I sincerely hope that we will always have dedicated and experienced occupational therapists to promote occupational therapy all over Europe, as described in this editorial, to make it accessible for all individuals and communities in need.

Joint COTEC-ENOTHE Congress Galway June 2016

planning to be at Congress make sure you come along and have your say.



COTEC 1986-2016

As you might be aware COTEC is celebrating its 30th birthday this year.

The first joint congress offers an excellent opportunity to organize some small events to mark this occasion.

COTEC was established in 1986 to co-ordinate the views of the National Associations of Occupational Therapy of the then Member States of the European Communities. The European Council in Brussels agreed in 1983 that "mutual recognition for diplomas was an important step in creating satisfactory conditions for the exercise of a number of professions" including occupational therapists.

The name of COTEC has been changed over the years from Committee of European Occupational Therapists (1986) via Committee of Occupational Therapists for the European Communities (1987) to Council of Occupational Therapists for the European Countries (2000-2001). Many meetings and successful congresses were organized by National Associations and hundreds of occupational therapists have given their time, expertise and energy to make COTEC what is today: a legal European organization that enables National Associations of Occupational Therapists to work together to develop, harmonise and improve standards of professional practice through a robust educational system, as well as advance the theory of Occupational Therapy throughout Europe to best address the social and health issues affecting the citizens of Europe.

COTEC has been connecting Occupational therapists in Europe for 30 years and will continue to do so striving to make Occupational Therapy visible, valued, available and accessible for all citizens in Europe.

COTEC Register of Experts

First nominations to the Register of Experts were made in early 2015 when eight COTEC Member Associations acted on the call made by COTEC Executive Committee. By today eleven associations have sent names of Experts and more nominations are expected in the near future.

The Register now has 66 individuals and seven national specialist groups in the eight Expert groups. The priorities for WHO Health 2020 and Europe 2020 were referred to when initialising the need for specific groups of Experts.

EPDA 100 Project

You will be aware that we have been working in collaboration with the European Parkinson's Disease Association (EPDA) for the last couple of years on the project titled 'My PD Journey'.

European Skills Competences and Occupations (ESCO) & Qualification Frameworks

COTEC has been involved in two European consultations regarding skills and competences and frameworks. This is important in the light of harmonising and improving standards of Occupational therapy.

European Skills Competences and Occupations consultation closed

In February 2016 the online consultation for the development of the ESCO classification was closed. Many occupational therapy experts have given feedback which was crucial in improving the draft description of Occupational Therapy in ESCO. In the next weeks a final report on the outcomes of this consultation will be send out to participants. The first public version of ESCO classification will be launched by the end of 2016.

Qualification Frameworks

COTEC was invited by ICF International (a management, technology, and policy consulting firm) to participate in a study on international sectoral qualifications or qualification frameworks. The study which is done on behalf of the European Commission, will inform future reflections on how these types of qualifications or frameworks could be linked to the European Qualifications Framework (EQF).

After consulting ENOTHE and expert S. Rowan (UK) COTEC has answered the consultation, citing the TUNING reference points, Tuning Sectoral Framework for Social Sciences and The Occupational Therapy Euromasters.

Patient Empowerment

COTEC is invited by EPF to give feedback on the draft Roadmap on Patient Empowerment, developed as part of the EPF thematic campaign on patient empowerment.

EPF is aiming to launch the Roadmap at the concluding event of the EPF campaign in Brussels, in late June.

We would very much welcome your feedback and ideas by 20 April 2016, after which we will revise the document.

The intention of Rehabilitation Experts is to promote rehabilitation as a core aspect within Finnish health policies while also strengthening the supervision of interests in the field.

She works as an assistant at the occupational therapy department within the faculty of health science at the University of Ljubljana. There she is clinical OT educator for students in the field of geriatrics, the use of assistive technologies, group dynamics and occupational therapy in primary care. As a PhD student, she is currently exploring the model of treatment of the elderly at home environment. In her spare time she likes cycling.

Public consultation on the review of the European Disability Strategy 2010-2020

There are approximately 80 million citizens with disabilities in the EU, who often face barriers that prevent them from fully participating in all aspects of life on an equal basis with others. In its commitment to eliminate these barriers and improve the life of people with disabilities, the EU became a party to the UN Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (UN Convention). Implementing the Convention is an ongoing process and it is a shared responsibility of the EU institutions and the Member States. The EU can only act within the powers conferred to it by the EU treaties. A first review of the EU's implementation of the UN Convention, done by the UN Committee on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities, recognised the progress achieved until now, but also provided some recommendations for the future.

At EU level, the UN Convention is implemented through the European Disability Strategy 2010-2020. This Strategy has identified eight main areas for action at EU level: Accessibility, Participation, Equality, Employment, Education and Training, Social Protection, Health and External Action. Having reached the halfway point in its implementation, the European Commission launched a public consultation in order to assess its impact and to ensure EU policy remains tailored to the needs and rights of persons with disabilities.

The survey researched the opinion on what has been achieved so far at EU level, views on the challenges faced by all persons with disabilities and how the European Union should address them.

The findings of this public consultation will be used to assess the progress made under the European Disability Strategy 2010-2020 and to identify gaps to be addressed at EU level to ensure the full and equal participation of persons with disabilities in society.

COTEC answered the consultation, send it to their Members and Tweeted about it.

Occupational Therapy and Oncology

The coordinator of the European Forum of Primary Care invited COTEC in collaboration with the Dutch association for OT, Ergotherapie Nederland (EN) to nominate an occupational therapist to represent Occupational Therapy in the working group Professional groups/experts with a special interest in cancer of the European Cancer Organisation ECC.
